Black males are victimized, arrested and incarcerated in much greater numbers than Black females. For example, in 2007, Black males were incarcerated at a rate of 3,138 per 100,000 Black males in the population; Black females were incarcerated at a rate of 150 per 100,000.

Racism in criminal justice processing has also been considered a factor in the greater representation of black women in the criminal justice system. Although females are generally treated more leniently than males by the criminal justice system, the high proportion of black females incarcerated may be due to their perceived violation of feminine patterns of crime (black women tend to be convicted of violent crimes).
