Review the Future Tense - BrainPOP ELL

In the past tense, (be) supposed to (was / were supposed to) means that we expected something to happen, but it didn't. For example: They were supposed to meet us at 2:00.. When speaking about the future, we use the present tense of (be) supposed to.. For example: He is supposed to travel to England next week.. In the negative, it can sometimes mean that something isn't allowed.
